Money Matters

Our Money Matters workshop equips students with the financial literacy skills needed to manage their money and budget effectively to prepare them for when they are earning in the future.

The Switch lead fun and interactive activities in which students explore financial terms and concepts, learn how much living in London really costs, and develop important skills for money management such as creating a budget.

In this hybrid session, business professionals join a video call to provide context on how they manage their money in their adult life and at work. Students also get the opportunity to ask business professionals any questions they have about money management and the world of work.





Skills for Success

Skills for Success shows Year 8 and Year 9 students how the soft skills they are developing in and out of school will help them in their future careers.

Facilitators run a range of fun and engaging activities focusing on employability skills, workplace behaviours, and identifying strengths and weaknesses. Students learn about the skills employers are looking for, self-assess their own skill levels and learn about careers of the future.

Business professionals join the workshop remotely via video call for an insightful Q&A, giving context on the skills they use and have developed in their careers.


the switch CVs & Assessment Centres /mpact



Mentoring sees volunteers from a range of organisations meet in-person, once a month, with a young person from Tower Hamlets (aged 14-17), supporting them to make key decisions about their future career and develop crucial employability skills.

Malaika was paired with a mentor from Aon, she has always dreamed of moving out of London, but wasn't sure about her options, now she's considering a degree-apprenticeship in Leeds or Glasgow.

'I think before Mentoring I would just get overwhelmed with everything, but I've learnt how to tackle one thing at a time. I definitely feel more confident, and I understand better what employers want and what skills they are looking for.


My mentor helped me raise my aspirations and taught me what kind of work environments I'd be okay with and helped my understanding of what a working career would look like.'

When asked about how she feels about her future now, she said:

'I feel more confident in myself and my future, I feel like whatever I do I will be able to make the most out of it. Even if I think I want to do architecture now and I do things to get into that career, if I decide to go into a different career, I can use those skills and put them to use for something else.'

71% of mentors agree that they have developed their ability to motivate and develop a young person.

94% of mentors would recommend mentoring to a colleague.



Youth Voice


Youth Voice places young people at the heart of The Switch's provision for Tower Hamlets. Students are invited to participate in a borough-wide youth advisory board focusing on careers development. Sessions provide a platform for feedback on what careers provision young people want and they hear from local employers on key employability topics.

A Year in Review

After a successful pilot in 2021–22, Youth Voice was launched as a new programme this year. It transforms students from just being service users to being co-creators, ensuring that what we offer is relevant for their age group, study plans and career aspirations.

This year, our cohort played a pivotal role in both reviewing existing programmes and in the development for new ones. Students reviewed our communication strategy with our Communications Coordinator – identifying ways we can improve our student engagement on our channels.

Students also got the opportunity to meet some professionals from KBC Bank and Toshiba – where they had an office tour and got to try some new products including printers and screens.

One key project the students participated in was testing our brand new Alumni Portal, which launched in Spring 2023. The session really brought to life the value of the programme for me personally, as students proved that sometimes our assumptions on what we think they want can be misguided.

During development our team had emphasised that the portal should be mobile friendly, believing students would primarily use it on their phones. However, students disagreed with us and told us "You don't plan for your future on your phone!" Their feedback allowed us to concentrate our resources effectively towards desktop users.

It has been so lovely working with our Youth Voice members, seeing them grow in confidence and the new friendships that have flourished. I am so proud of their achievements. I share my heartfelt thanks to them for their contributions to The Switch.

Our Virtual Work Experience programme provides students with valuable experiences of work within a choice of four diverse industries:

- Business & Finance
- Construction, Architecture & Engineering
- IT & Technology
- Creative & Media

Students gain invaluable insight into the world of work and engage with employers from their chosen sector, equipping them with essential skills to prepare them for hybrid working models and future work practices. During their placement, students will collaborate on a group project based on real-world data and activities, culminating in a virtual presentation to industry professionals where they will receive constructive feedback vital for their personal and professional growth.

Virtual Work Experience helps schools meet Gatsby Benchmark 6 – Experiences of workplaces.






