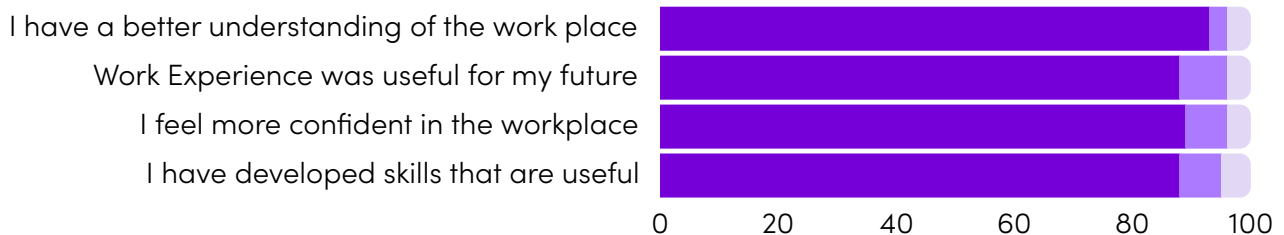

Work Experience Case Study 2025-2026



"I feel like my coursework is more complete now because we were mostly researching and stuff, but now we get to put that research and everything into action." – Tamira, student at Central Foundation Girls' School

IntoUniversity welcomed four Year 12 BTEC Health & Social Care students from Central Foundation Girls' School in April 2026. While their work experience placement was a compulsory part of their qualifications, they gained far more than just a course requirement during their time with IntoUniversity.

Through supporting the children in workshops and shadowing the staff at IntoUniversity, the students developed key workplace skills and gained valuable insight into working with children. Communication emerged as one of the most important skills they strengthened, particularly when supporting children in their workshops. As Khadija reflected:

"You need to change the way you speak to students so they understand."

Through this experience, the students learnt how to adapt their communication styles, allowing them to build strong relationships with the children.

This skill was especially important when working with students with Special Educational Needs (SEN), as reflected by Mahida, who shared:

"I'd have to be more patient with [SEN children] and work on their level so they can properly understand the work."

The experience also enabled the students to make more informed career choices. Several students shared an interest in careers such as paediatric nursing and teaching. Through the guidance and support of IntoUniversity staff, they gained valuable insight into working with children and the skills these careers require.

"I want to become a teacher, so seeing the IntoUniversity staff teach [the children] and how they interact with the students [was helpful]. It was kind of like they were my role models." – Mahida

This demonstrates the value of work experience in helping young people turn classroom learning into practical skills, build confidence in the workplace and make informed decisions about their futures.
